NEWS OF SOCIAL SECURITY

ADVOCATES FOR A UNIQUE GROUP OF SENIORS SAY MORE THAN ONE HUNDRED MEMBERS OF THE U-S HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES BELIEVE IT'S TIME TO CORRECT A PROBLEM FACED BY A PARTICULAR SET OF OLDER AMERICANS. THE PROBLEM IS A DISPARITY IN SOCIAL SECURITY BENEFITS THAT AFFECTS SENIORS BORN FROM 1917 THROUGH 1926. THE MEMBERS OF THIS GROUP ARE ALSO KNOWN AS NOTCH BABIES. HOUSE BILL H-R-6-1-5—ALSO CALLED THE NOTCH FAIRNESS ACT—IS A BI-PARTISAN EFFORT TO PROVIDE THESE SENIORS WITH A FIVE THOUSAND DOLLAR LUMP-SUM PAYMENT, OR IMPROVED MONTHLY SOCIAL SECURITY BENEFITS. ACCORDING TO STUDIES FOR TREA SENIOR CITIZENS LEAGUE, MANY NOTCH BABIES RECEIVE A SOCIAL SECURITY BENEFIT THAT'S ABOUT ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS PER MONTH LOWER THAN OTHER SENIORS WITH SIMILAR WORK AND EARNINGS RECORDS. THE LEAGUE URGES SENIORS TO ASK THEIR MEMBERS OF CONGRESS TO SUPPORT THE NOTCH FAIRNESS ACT.
